We have enjoyed getting to know your child over these beginning weeks of school. One of the things we do in this first month of school is to give some brief preschool assessments. These are done to understand your child's educational needs so we can plan our instruction to help them learn and grow! We wanted to share your child's results on these beginning-of-year preschool assessments. Young children don't always show us everything they know during an assessment, and their learning and needs change quickly as they are provided with instruction and support in preschool. We give assessments across preschools to understand their learning and changing needs. We use assessment information and information from classroom activities to guide our instruction. The first table outlines the results of our assessments, which looked at your child's knowledge of colors, counting, numbers, shapes, and letters. The second table outlines our classroom observations of your child's language skills, how the transition to school has gone, and their interactions in the classroom.
